WHO ARE WE?

Adventist Church has been sharing the love of Jesus Christ to the world. The movement began during a time of religious revival in 19th Century North America when Baptist preacher William Miller predicted that Jesus would return on October 22, 1844. Many were convicted by his preaching but were ultimately disappointed when the date came and went with no sign of Jesus. While most of Miller's followers dispersed a small group continued to anticipate Jesus' return as they studied and


searched the Bible for answers. It was this small group, which included Ellen and James White and Joseph Bates, that founded the original church that chose the name "Seventh-day Adventist" and organised in Battle Creek, Michigan, USA with 125 Churches and 3,500 members. The name "Seventh-day Adventist" is based on the Church's observance of the 'biblical Sabbath' on Saturday, the seventh day of the week and our passionate belief in the soon return of Jesus to this earth.



There are now over 20 million Seventh-day Adventists worldwide worshipping in over 150,000 congregations across 209 countries. Seventh-day Adventists believe that Christ ministered to the whole person and are passionate advocates for not just spiritual wholeness, but bringing healing to the body and mind as well. The Church operates the largest protestant education system in the world with over 7,500 schools as well as over 100 hospitals, numerous publishing houses and a

humanitarian aid organisation known as the Adventist Development and Relief Agency (ADRA).

The vision of the Seventh-day
Adventist Church in Australia is
to be a thriving disciple-making
movement. In a world where it often
seems that things are out of control
and many are struggling, we want to
share the good news that Jesus loves
each one of us and has a plan for
our lives.

THE Great Controversy

: Growing IN CHRIST





Remnant

Unity IN THE

All Jesus' new creations find meaning in discovering God's plan for their lives, growing closer to Him, doing good in the world around them and sharing the message of salvation with others.

The night before Jesus died, He did something His disciples would never forget. Acting like a servant, He washed their dirty feet. Then He served their meal to them. Jesus wanted all of us to understand putting others first and serving them was an important part of His Kingdom. The water was His promise to wash away the dust of our journey towards Heaven. The grape juice and bread were reminders of His spilled blood and His body, broken on the cross to save us. The church follows Jesus' example by celebrating the Lord's Supper as a reminder of His saving gift.

The Lord Jesus, on the night he was betrayed, took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body, which is for you; do this in remembrance of me." In the same way, after supper he took the cup, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood; do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me." For whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

: Sanctuary



Second Coming




