About Prescott College Southern

Established in 1977, Prescott College Southern provides a comprehensive educational program in a Christian context for students from Foundation to Year 12. The school is located on a large, leafy campus which provides a sense of space and connection to the environment. We support our students in achieving their potential in all areas of their development; academic, physical, emotional and spiritual. We recognise that each student is an individual and courses of study are tailored to meet their needs, building on their strengths and providing opportunities for growth and development that are both challenging and achievable.

We are proud to be part of the Prescott Schools system (SA) which is owned and operated by the Seventh-day Adventist Church. Prescott College Southern is one of three schools in this network within South Australia, with the other two schools located at Prospect and Para Vista. Internationally, we are part of the world-wide Seventh-day Adventist school system—a global network of around 10,000 educational institutions operating in more than 100 countries. This is the largest protestant education system in the world, educating more than two million students each year.

What do we offer your child?

Prescott College Southern provides a warm, caring environment where children can learn to relate positively to their peers, staff, and other adults through quality educational programs both inside and out of the classroom.

We recognise the uniqueness of each individual and prioritise helping every student develop academically, socially, spiritually, emotionally, and physically, to provide them with every chance of success.

Differentiated Curriculum

Prescott College Southern customises programs to meet each child's unique learning needs, placing them in levels based on achievement rather than age. This approach promotes satisfaction, challenge and success. We never take a 'one size fits all' approach to educating our students.



Positive Christian Education

Our teachers are dedicated to nurturing Christian values and the acceptance of others, along with promoting healthy and positive self-esteem. This is achieved through the co-curricular and extra-curricular programs we offer.

All year levels start the day with morning worship and students participate in religion classes right through to Year 12. Our values are embedded across the curriculum and they define the approach we take to working with our students.





Values-Based Education

Prescott College Southern integrates values into all subjects, promoting a positive lifestyle and community. Students are encouraged to practice cooperative behaviour and self-discipline.

Positive behaviour for learning underpins the strategies we use when working with children. This promotes self-worth, self-control, and responsibility within a Christian context, through the use of restorative practices. Courtesy and respect for everyone are hallmarks of our programs.



Family Partnerships

The school encourages parents to be part of their child's educational program through volunteering in reading support, library, and administration tasks.

Our staff recognise the importance of collaboration between school and home to maximise the learning potential of our students.

To achieve this aim our secondary school employs a process of continuous reporting where parents have access in real time to students grades and teacher feedback regarding their child's progress, via the Parent Portal.

Parents of students in the secondary school also enjoy access to student assessment tasks and deadlines through the portal enabling them to keep up to date with their child's learning.

Parent/teacher interviews are scheduled throughout the year and written reports provided at the end of each semester. Parents are always able to connect with our staff to discuss school whenever they need.

Our Learning

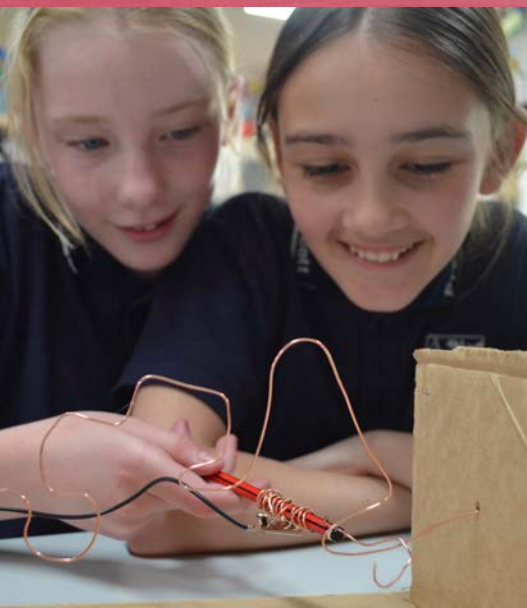

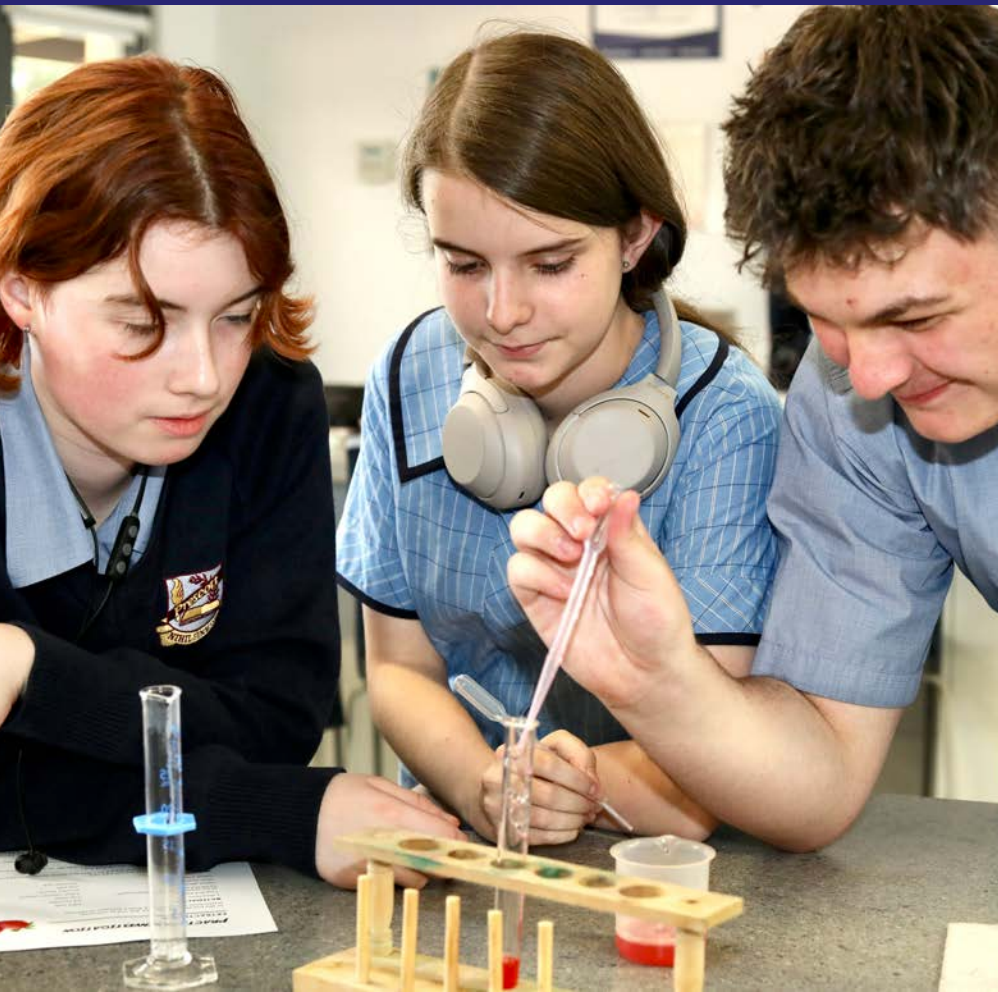

Senior School

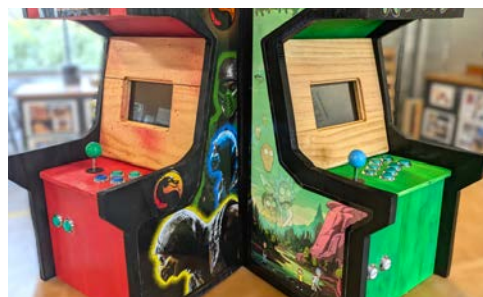
The South Australian Certificate of Education (SACE) is awarded to students who successfully complete Years 11 and 12.

SACE traditionally has two stages: Stage 1 (Year 11) and Stage 2 (Year 12), with a broad range of subjects available to study at these levels.

We choose to offer select subjects of the SACE program at Year 10 to provide our students with every chance of success.

SACE Pathways

We offers pathways for students in their journey towards the completion of their SACE Certificate. This includes university entrance, TAFE and school based apprenticeships.



Vocational Education Training (VET)

In Years 11 and 12 students can choose to study from a diverse range of VET courses to contribute towards their South Australian Certificate of Education (SACE) and prepare for future careers.

Studying VET at Prescott College Southern allows students to learn in the familiar, supportive environment they are used to while aligning with their individual interests and long-term career goals. This is a popular pathway for many students at Year 11 and 12.



Senior Pathways

Prescott College Southern is proud to have 100% of our Year 12 students successfully complete their SACE each year. This is achieved through an individually tailored program that is relevant and engaging.

Opportunities

At Prescott College Southern, every student has the opportunity to cultivate their talents, skills, and interests beyond the classroom. They can explore a wide range of extracurricular and co-curricular activities that enhance our academic programs.

Learning Beyond the Classroom

Students at every year level take part in programs outside of the classroom that develop positive life skills. We have a vibrant program of school camps and activities and outdoor education experiences on offer.

Service and Leadership

Service and leadership opportunities allow students to develop important skills, enabling them contribute to their community, and take on responsibilities that help them grow as individuals. Some of these opportunities include the Peer Support Program, the Quest Wellbeing Program, service trips such as STORMCo, Community Service Projects, Club Leadership, School and Sport Captains.

Sport

We are part of the South Australian Christian Schools Sport Association (SACSA), competing with other Christian schools in the metropolitan area. Primary students can also join SAPSASA events. Our extra curricular sporting programs run during the week and our parents love that there are no school sport commitments on the weekend.

Music and Performing Arts

There are a variety of music opportunities on offer that cater to different interests and talents. These include the Chapel Band, Chamber Ensemble, Vocal Ensemble, and our school musical productions. These music not only enhance students' musical skills but also foster a sense of community and personal growth. We offer private instrument tuition in dedicated music rooms for students who are passionate about music and wish to learn an instrument. Instruments available include voice, piano, clarinet, guitar, flute, drums, and saxophone.

There are a number of clubs on campus to provide opportunities for students to develop new skills, explore their passions, and build friendships. Some of our popular clubs include Chess, STEM, and Art Club.



Other Services Available

We are pleased to be able to offer the following services, to support families within the school community.

School Bus Service

Prescott College Southern operates a school bus service in conjunction with Willunga Charter. Students are picked up and dropped off at a local public bus stop as close as possible to their home, along the regular school routes. Our students enjoy travelling in large modern, air conditioned coaches, with seatbelts. Our parents appreciate the ability to follow their child's journey through an app and the notifications they receive upon pick up and arrival.

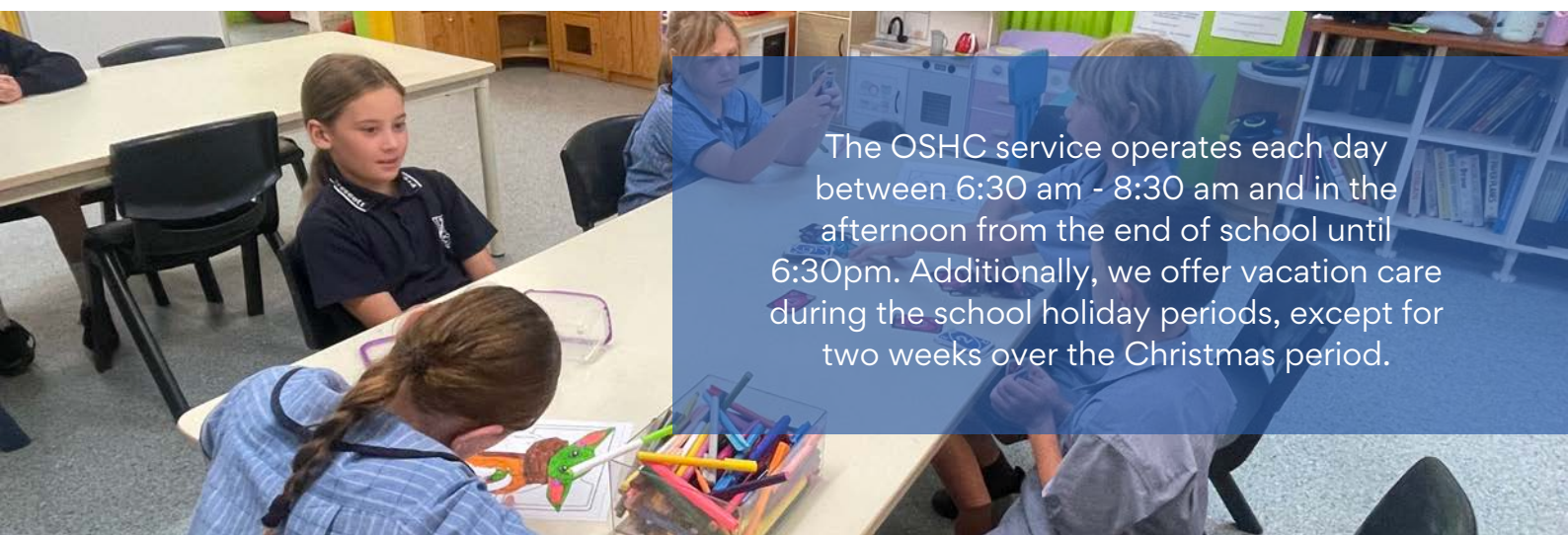
Uniform Shop

Our uniform shop enables parents to source their uniform needs at one convenient location. The shop is located on campus, adjacent to the OSHC service and is open at regular times throughout the week and school holidays..

Out of School Hours Care (OSHC) and Vacation Care

Our OSHC program is a vibrant, nurturing environment where children can continue to thrive outside of regular school hours. The program is run by dedicated and consistent staff who are employed by the school and they offer activities that promote connectedness while being fun and engaging. The cost of Out of School Hours Care varies depending on your eligibility for the Child Care Rebate.

The OSHC service operates each day between 6:30 am - 8:30 am and in the afternoon from the end of school until 6:30pm. Additionally, we offer vacation care during the school holiday periods, except for two weeks over the Christmas period.

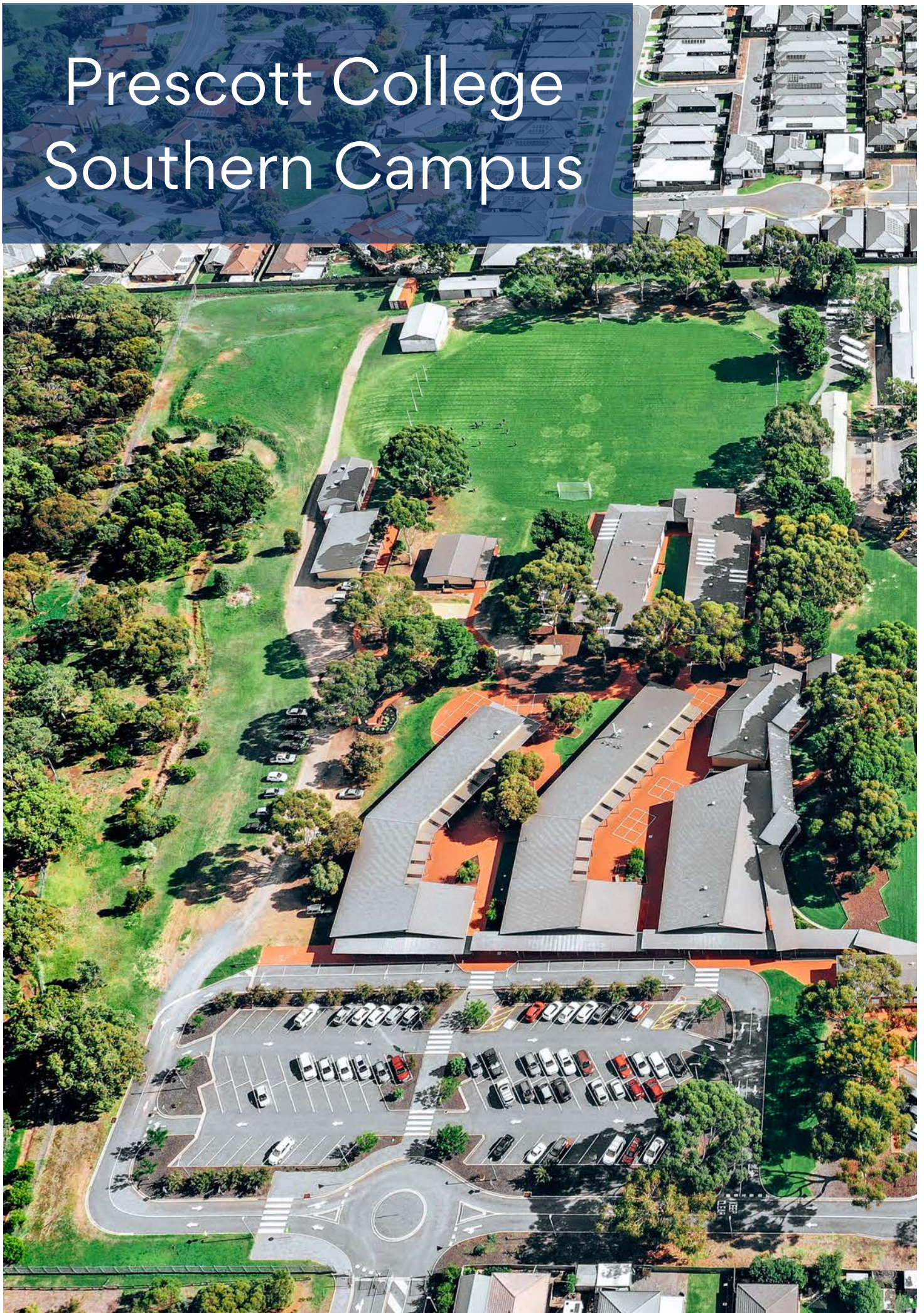
